 - This year all but one of the board members are in the symposium, last year's annual meeting complained about the low participation rate of board members to NOSA symposia
 - Currently 352 members, but will be revised, only active members since 2001 will be counted: Participants of NOSA symposia are automatically added as members
 - NOSA2005 Göteborg 79 participants, 56 abstracts
 - Aerosologists award

 - Board meetings : two telephone meetings January and October 2006
 - NOSA voted for Manchester to host EAC 2009, Karlsruhe was selected

- NOSA participated at EAA and IARA board meetings
IARA: Erik Swietlicki, Kaarle Hämeri (also FAAR)
EAA: Erik Swietlicki, Sara Janhäll (acting as secretary during the meeting)
- Budget: constant: 10908 SEK, minor costs for telephone meeting from President account
- EAA board meeting report (Erik Swietlicki)
 - Erik Swietlicki (President) and Sara Janhäll (acting as a secretary) represented NOSA.
 - Erik Swietlicki was president of EAA for 2 years, now the president is Prof Michael Shapiro from the Israeli society
 - Greece was accepted as a member of EAA
 - Close vote for EAC 2009 host between Karlsruhe and Manchester, Czech vote was late and not accepted, Karlsruhe was selected
 - Two new members coming in the near future: Italy and Spain
 - Elsevier contract finally signed after several years of mainly technical problems
 - New chairman of Junge award committee is Ian Ford (U. K.), award will be given 2007 in Salzburg, nominations welcome
- IARA board meeting report (Kaarle Hämeri)
 - Erik Swietlicki, Kaarle Hämeri (also FAAR) represented NOSA
 - Europe has a strong role in IARA
 - Board meetings every year, this time in connection with IAC2006, St. Paul, U.S.A.
 - Helsinki selected last year as a host of IAC2010.
 - Fissan-Pui-TSI –award (for intercontinental collaboration) given for the first time this year to Paul E. Morrow and Werner Stöber
 - Fuchs award is arguably the highest award in aerosol physics, this is not a IARA award but given by GAeF (German association), JAAST (Japanese association) and AAAR (U.S. association) The award was given for Rick Flagan and Peter McMurry.
 - Hungarian aerosol association accepted as a member of IARA
 - Officers elected every year:
 - President of IAC will be president of IARA for the next 4 years, now David Pui (U.S.A.)
 - Vice president Kaarle Hämeri (Finland, host of next IAC)
 - General secretary Mansoo Choi (Korea)
 - Upcoming conferences:
 - EAC2007 Salzburg
 - EAC2008 Thessaloniki
 - EAC2009 Karlsruhe
 - IAC2010 Helsinki

- Decision about NOSA2007
 - Matthias Ketzler presented plans for Lo-skolen, north of Helsingör in Denmark, dates: 7.Nov – 9.Nov. 2007
